Obviously, an argument that can prove the enforcement method generated an erroneous determination of the speed of the target vehicle can be very effective in court. However, to clearly show an erroneous speed detection in addition to the necessary knowledge about the enforcement method, it is important to find in accuracies that may be unique to the ticket such as; location of the violation, roadway condition, officer's line of sight, traffic conditions, weather and etc.
